- The readings while there are a lot really helped my understanding during lectures and primed me to understand the topics we discussed. While a little difficult with a class on the more quiet side, I appreciated the discussion aspect of the course as well. Lectures were awesome and I learned a ton. I also loved the guest lectur.
- · Professor really knew what he was talking about and had plenty of experience. He was always willing to answer any questions and really wanted you to learn.
- Professor Basseches explained concepts well for lots of people in the class that initially had limited political science knowledge, especially myself. He also seemed to value everyone's opinion and never made anyone feel stupid or less than. I liked the grading format and assignments, especially the readings (which 1. were genuinely interesting and 2. felt doable/reasonable) and open-ended discussion questions as the only main homework. - an obscene amount of reading each week, but Prof Basseches knew this and taught us how to approach it -l didn't like that the midterm paper HAD to use readings from class and response to the questions I thought this was limiting instead of helpful. I wish that you could submit your own topic for approval instead of responding to the prompts. -use of canvas: discussions weren't dated as deadlines, which meant that they weren't visible on our calendar. "messages" are not as useful as "announcements" on canvas I had a hard time finding things because they were sent to the inbox rather than onto the course page stream. why were grades never posted on canvas??? -new-found pet peeve: professors showing zoom lectures or other recorded lectures DURING class. it was super not engaging. especially when it was them showing themselves talking just lecture on it! I don't want to hear you talk to people on zoom. just talk to us. bring us back in the moment. I wish that Professor Basseches did this less frequently, and only showed 1-2 video lectures the entire semester, instead of the 5-8 that he showed us.

- Though all the topics covered in the class were interesting, I wish we had spent less time dissecting the failures of market-based policies and more on other actually-helpful climate policies, especially when the final paper prompt asks us to write about what would work.
- I think that there should have been a focus on more diverse authors and political thinkers that focus on how race plays a role in environmental policy. Perhaps getting someone to come in and speak to the class about the Environmental Justice perspective.
- I think this class would be more successful if it met more than one time a week. With the amount of readings assigned, it wasn't very productive having only one class a week to go over them I think with 3 classes (or 2) it would provide better structure for the course and lead to more participation.
