Professor Josh is a very smart guy and knows what he is talking about. However, his lack of teaching experience shows in the classroom. His class did not have an attendance policy which is fine, but I feel like every class he has complained about how people are not showing up to class. When there is no attendance policy, people do not have as much incentive to come to class. His reasoning for no attendance policy was that he does not want to keep track of individual excuses which is totally valid, but you cannot complain when people do not show up to class. College students have lives and things going on so you cannot go after people for not coming to class. The first midterm was reasonable and not too difficult and he even was open for feedback which was amazing. The final paper requirements are very unreasonable and I have never seen anything this big for a political science class. He is also very strict about deadlines. I submitted an assignment about 5 minutes after the deadline and he docked points. Every other professor I've had do not adhere to hard deadlines and still accept it if it is submitted a bit after the deadline. He is too strict about certain things for someone who has very little teaching experience.

- I think we could have connected the concepts more to current events and talked about current political debates in state+local politics so as to create an engaging frame of reference for the theories we talked about
- One of the aspects of the course in need of improvement is clarity. I find that though Professor lectures in a clear, efficient way, some of the material can get foggy as he tends to lecture quick, which does not really leave room for clarification. Though, I really enjoyed his class and overall he's one of those professors that is really relatable, and you can always count on him for support whenever vou're structuraling.
- I think the final paper should be less. He is asking for too much and too many requirements. Also, classes should not have hard deadlines. Submitting 5 mins after the deadline is not the end of the world.
- consider counting attendance as 5% of overall grade this will encourage attendance and reward students that regularly attend class. This will also not penalize students too harshly if they have extenuating circumstances that prevent them from attending class.
- While there will always be people who do not attend class, I would implement a harsher penalty for missing a certain amount of classes. For example, maybe create a policy that everyone has 6 excused absences no questions asked, but if someone needs more than that then there will be grade penalties (obviously exceptions for extreme situations like mono or a death in someones family).
- I thought that the Laboratories against democracy book was pretty terrible as far as assigned texts go. Additionally, I felt like some of the class sessions were not very engaging, and when we did things like organizing the states by date of ratification for 30 minutes, they felt like a waste of time or a high school class activity which I did not care for.
