- This was my second time taking a Basseches course and it went extremely well. You are clearly very knowledgeable about the material, you explain things clearly, and you are very nice/approachable. Your canvas page and syllabus is extremely organized which is MUCH appreciated by myself and other students, and your assignment guidelines are thorough. I would only recommend one change to this course. Personally, I do the assigned class readings, not only because I want to be able to participate in class but also because I am a political science major and this material interests me. However, and as you may observe, many people do not read. I think one thing to consider is instead of trying to motivate students to read, which is difficult, you can begin each class with a small lecture going over the reading's main points before going into discussion. You already do this in some capacity, but more so by asking questions about the reading and explaining the answers rather than straight lecturing. This idea may be unfair to students who do read and may incentivize less students to read, but it also may enhance class discussions (it is just a balance to consider). Also, the pop quizzes are a good idea to maintain attendance in theory, but many students are likely willing to disregard the weight of pop quizzes on their grade in exchange for not going to class. Attendance is not mandatory, and im guessing many students simply do not care enough about the pop quizzes to regularly attend class. If they won't attend every/most classes anyway, they definitely won't try and strategically weigh what classes may have a pop quiz or not. just something to consider.

- Professor was so great! The class was always interesting and the format of lecture and discussion/ sometimes inside and sometimes outside was great. And the guest speakers were great. The attendance policy was great lenient but still got me to go to most classes. The professor seemed very smart and could provide real work experience and application to the class discussions. I learned the most when we discussed the ACA and environmental activism. On that same note, I DID learn about "backdoor" legislative practices that I didn't know about before. Overall, I really liked the course and its structure.

- I don't have any big improvements other than we should discuss more activism, lol.
- I think the random pop quizzes for attendance could be changed to a different attendance system. I think it would be less stressful if regular attendance were taken and individuals could take the quizzes anonymously since they were not being graded.
- I strongly believe many students took advantage of the attendance policy and therefore it decreased the benefits of the class for those who did show up, since there were many days only half the class showed and discussions were slow. I think attendance should be necessary if you want everyone to come engaged. Likewise, I appreciated having reading quizzes to grade our attendance, but I noticed a pattern that if there were no reading quizzes then no one did the readings.
